Getting Started with Watercolors

Supply List

Watercolor paper —- **140 lb (or higher) cold pressed,** 9x12 or larger Recommended — Arches Watercolor Pad 9x12 140lb cold pressed

Watercolor brushes —- 1/2 flat and #8 round Recommended - Cheap Joes Golden Fleece Brushes

if you have other brushes, bring them, too.

Watercolor paint (student grade is fine).

Recommended — Winsor & Newton Cotman Watercolors in 8ml tubes

Alizarim Crimson Cadmium Yellow Hooker's Green Ultramarine Blue Burnt Sienna

**if you already have basic paint colors, bring those. You don't have to have the exact colors listed above*

Board to tape paper to. 18x24 is a good size. But it just needs to be larger than the paper you are using. Masonite or Gatorboard are example of boards that will work.

Palette. — cheap ones from Michael's are fine. You need something to hold blobs of paint (paint wells) and a flat surface to mix the paint. An egg carton and a small plate will work.

A roll of paper towels -- Viva works really well

2 Water containers. I use yogurt containers (32 oz)

Old toothbrush

Pencil

Kneaded eraser

You can get all these supplies online at sites like <u>CheapJoes.com</u> or <u>DickBlick.com</u>. Michael's and Hobby Lobby also carry some of these items. Do not buy the Hobby Lobby or Michael's store brand paint.
