

Art 101 Class Supplies

I encourage my students to paint large and loose, use large brushes and stand up while painting. (You need ***to constantly back up*** to see what you have!!!) Your painting will look different from a distance. However, if you can't stand for long periods, we also have table easels.

Paints:

- At a minimum you will need one of each of the three primary colors: red, yellow and blue, plus a white.
- A basic color wheel will help you mix other colors.
- A warm and cool shade of the primary colors are good to have but not necessary. You are welcome to bring any colors you enjoy. I've listed some below.

Warm Colors 1st listed / Cool Colors 2nd listed

REDS: Cadmium Red / Alizarin Red

YELLOWs: Cadmium yellow / Cadmium Yellow Light or Lemon Yellow

BLUES: Cerulean Blue/ Ultramarine blue

Titanium White

Other fun colors to have but not necessary:

GREENS: Hookers green / Sap Green

PINK SHADES: either Magenta or Rose to create true pinks

EARTH COLORS: Yellow Ochre, Burnt Sienna, Naples Yellow, Unbleached Titanium

DARKS: Mars Black – (Instead of black I use Paynes Gray, Dioxazin Purple and/or Hookers Green - but mixing complimentary colors to create a dark is lots of fun!)

Canvases: three - 12" squares and one 20" square

Brushes: Suggested

- One ½", one 1" and one 1.5" flat/square - plus one small round for detail

One roll of Paper Towels
